



## VILLAGE OF CORRALES

### RESOLUTION NO. 11-038

**A Resolution to Establish a Task Force to make recommendations regarding the Public Right-of-Way on West Meadowlark Lane from Loma Larga to the Village Boundary**

**Whereas**, West Meadowlark Lane between Loma Larga and the Village boundary with the City of Rio Rancho is a residential road with a right-of-way 60 feet wide; and

**Whereas**, West Meadowlark Lane, because of its volume of traffic, is considered an urban collector by the Metropolitan Planning Organization; and

**Whereas**, on its southern side, seven calles and driveways provide access to the Lane for approximately 26 residences, with, in some instances, obstructed line-of-sight problems for residents and passing motorists; and

**Whereas**, on its northern side, approximately 16 residences access the public road with driveways; and

**Whereas**, because of its grade and existing obstructions, West Meadowlark Lane could present drainage problems for the public right-of-way and adjoining properties; and

**Whereas**, by vote of the Village Council October 26, 2004, sixteen speed tables or humps were installed to calm traffic flow on West Meadowlark Lane; and

**Whereas**, in the event of a civic emergency evacuation situation, West Meadowlark Lane is one of three improved roads for exiting the Village; and


**Whereas**, the Governing Body from time to time benefits from, and is informed by, studies conducted by citizen appointees to perform specific tasks,

**Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Governing Body of the Village of Corrales, New Mexico that:**


- 1. A Task Force consisting of four members shall be appointed to examine and recommend improvements to the public right-of-way of West Meadowlark Lane from Loma Larga to the Village boundary with the City of Rio Rancho.
- 2. Task Force members shall include: at least two residents of the West Meadowlark Lane neighborhood; at least one individual trained in the engineering profession; and at least one individual trained in the legal profession.
- 3. The Task Force shall provide public notice of its meetings and invite public comment .
- 4. The Task Force shall present its findings and recommendations, if any, to the Governing Body no later than May 31, 2012.
